Every year the country is visited by more than a million tourists who come here, attracted by the Czech history, culture and landscape.



The Czech Republic is country with rich culture, history and natural beauty.










You can see many castles and chateaux.

Lanškroun





The industrial town has a rich and interesting history and lies in the foothills of the Orlické Mountains, on the borderland of Bohemia and Moravia. The name Lanškroun comes from the German "Landeskrone", and has the royal crown in the town emblem.





The town probably arose in the connection with the colonization in the second half of the 13th century which was carried out by the Sirs of Drnholc under the reign of Bohemian King Přemysl Otakar II. It became a centre of Lanškroun-Lanšperk estate.





The first written mention of the town originates from the year 1285 when it was together with the whole estate taken over from the King Wanceslas II. By his father-in-law Zavis of Falkstein.





The most significant native Jan Marek was born in the year 1595. His name has crossed the borders and overcome the ages. Marci had a philosophical and natural science education. He was a rector of Charles University, he was considered to be a founder of spectroscopy.





The town of Lanškroun is a fast-growing modern town with ten thousand inhabitans. It is an administrative and economic centre of Lanškroun region with 22 villages. The main industries are electronics and engineering industry and civil engineering.








